# **PROGRAMME**

### **INTRODUCTION**

Malmö is Sweden's third largest and fastest growing city, with a relatively young population of approximately 350 000 residents, of whom roughly half are under the age of 35. People from 183 different countries live in Malmö, and around onethird of residents were born in another country. Nearly 25% of Malmö's children live in poverty.

The Department for Culture of the City of Malmö has been working with the UCLG Culture Committee since 2016. In recent years, the city of Malmö has shown how fundamental it is to localise development, that is, to empower local populations with the capacities to hold rights and unfold freedoms. In 2021, the Municipal Executive Board of the City of Malmö decided to launch several initiatives to combat racism, including instructing the Department of Culture to produce programmes and exhibitions which aim to counteract Afrophobia and Islamophobia.

In 2022, the work of Malmö as a Leading City is focusing in cultural policies and antiracism, with a focus on anti-islamophobia. This work began in February 2022 and will become very visible on 21-22-23 September 2022, with two activities:

- A seminar on Islamophobia, on Wednesday 21 September 2022.
- An in-depth peer-learning event with cities that are working in this field, on Wednesday 21, Thursday 22 and Friday 23 September 2022.

#### MALMÖ, LEADING CITY

The Leading Cities programme is coordinated by the Committee on Culture of United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG) in the context of efforts to support the implementation of the Agenda 21 for culture. This programme is aimed to support experienced cities through activities in the fields of leadership, advocacy, communication, learning and cooperation. Leading Cities are cities with experience in the implementation of the Agenda 21 for culture and possessing solid conceptual and practical experience as regards the place of culture in sustainable cities. As a result, they become leaders in the implementation of Culture 21 Actions, and the advocacy activities of the Committee on Culture of

Leading Cities such as Malmö receive support from the Secretariat of the Committee on Culture, annually in the following These activities will allow participants to:

- Reflect on how culture and antiracism relate to sustainable development
- Highlight the role of culture and art in antiracism
- Disseminate good practices in Malmö's antiracist work, and position Malmö's antiracist initiatives nationally and internationally
- Widen the discussion on racism and antiracism among cities and organizations, to develop awareness and knowledge in society.
- Provide the opportunity to learn from other cities and cultural actors on this topic and share experiences
- Make antiracist initiatives visible in a larger context and initiate more collaborations

domains: "Leadership and Advocacy", "Communication" and "Cooperation and Learning". The specific forms of assistance and support to be provided to each city are designed through consultation between them and the Secretariat of the Committee, since the aim of the Leading Cities programme is to tailor services to local needs and demands. The seminar and peer-learning session on culture and antiracism organised by Malmö is an activity fully inscribed in this programme.
